

General Meeting Friday 17 July

Ian Keable (right) gave an erudite, informative and very entertaining account of the life and works of the 18th century cartoonist, James Gillray. We learnt that he was the successor to Hogarth and by showing cartoons from both, Ian was able to explain how their approaches differed. He also pointed out that it was only with the weakening of the power of the King and the arrival of our first Prime Minister, William Pitt, that satirical cartoons began to be produced. He suggested that anyone who drew cartoons satirising Henry VIII, for example, might wonder where his head would end up.





Pitt, King George III, Sheridan (the playwright and impresario) were all targets of Gillray's cartoons in which we saw scenes full of detail, unlike modern cartoons which make a single point. Gillray continued to be a thorn in the side of the establishment until he was incapacitated by mental disorder in his later years; suffering possibly with bipolar disorder, as King George may also have done. As an aside we learnt the (maybe apocryphal) tale that when Alan Bennett's play, The Madness of George III, was turned into a film it was re-titled,

The Madness of King George, for American audiences for fear that they would feel they had missed The Madness of George I and II.

Fay Dowker - Inner Space, Outer Space: 100 years of General Relativity 2.05pm

> This year, 2015, we are celebrating the 100th anniversary of the theory of gravity we call General Relativity, or GR for short. In the intervening years, GR has been very successful in explaining the physics of Outer Space, of the solar system, of galaxies and of the whole universe on the largest scales that we can observe. Fay will give an account of some of the underlying concepts of General Relativity that emphasises their intuitive aspects, appealing to the Inner Space of our conscious perceptions to argue that GR is not just more scientifically accurate but more in tune with our intimate experience than its predecessor theory, Newtonian Gravity. It leaves one puzzle unsolved however: how to explain our experience of the passage of time.

Judith Mank - The evolution of males and females 2.50pm

> Males and females in many species are often quite different from one another. The sex of an individual can have profound effects on how an organisms behaves, how it looks, how it lives and, in some cases, even how it dies. These differences are the product of different evolutionary forces acting on males and females, sometimes creating substantial conflicts between the sexes. In this talk, I'll give a quick tour of how sex is genetically programmed and how sex differences evolve.

> It's inevitable, isn't it? One day robots will take over the world, either through some kind of violent rebellion, or through the back door - by taking all our jobs. Aren't we throwing caution to the wind by ignoring this threat? Well, by explaining some of the basic principles behind artificial intelligence and robotics, Nick Hawes will try to convince you that all those science fiction writers are wrong, and whilst robots will have a large part to play in our future, you don't need to worry about the effect

they'll have on our existence.
