You Cannot Be Serious — Tales from a Wimbledon Umpire

Alan Gray, former Wimbledon Tennis Umpire, gave an extremely interesting presentation to our group when he visited for the monthly meeting on Friday 20 April 2018. Although his largely biographical tale was woven around the topic of world class tennis, it was also of general interest and gave a good insight into some of the personalities of the period and to the present day.

Alan imparted many facts related to Wimbledon including the full name 'All England Tennis & Croquet Club' and some of the history of its 19 courts and the 662 matches that are played there in the annual Wimbledon Tennis Tournament.



Alan related humorous events from his memories and asked the audience if they knew the name of the lady in the most popular photograph of a tennis player? He advised that her name is Fiona Butler, unknown to most but when Alan placed the picture of the lady on the stage the somewhat cheeky and familiar pose of the rear view of Fiona with spare tennis balls tucked into the back of her knickers was known to all, with over two million copies of the image revealed it was hardly surprising but poor Fiona never made a penny piece from the photograph.

Alan's umpiring career lasted for 25 years, during which time he umpired six men's finals and four lady's finals. He saw many changes in those years, including equality of prize money, where currently the cash prize for both finals stands at about £2.2 million. It is a far cry from the 1961 Ladies final between Angela Mortimer and Christine Trueman when Miss Mortimer pocketed a £20 voucher to be spent on tennis equipment at a Lillywhites London store.

There have also been significant changes to the Wimbledon Courts complex with the introduction of the electronic Hawkeye line judging system installed in 4 of the 19 courts and most importantly the closing roof of the centre court so that play can continue in vital matches, however inclement the weather. The closing and introduction of blown dry air takes about 30 minutes to achieve.

It was of great interest to learn something of Andy Murray's early years, when his mother Judy would bring a mini bus with aspiring young tennis players south of the border from their home in Scotland's Dunblane, to compete against better quality opposition than they would have found on home soil. Although Andy was possibly hyperactive as an adolescent, there is no doubt that he has a great skill and passion for the game, which has made him the competitive champion that we see today.

Touching briefly on John McEnroe's widely reported comment from June 1989 Alan revealed the full quotation which was very nasty in content and delivery. A similar outburst in current times would result in disqualification from the tournament.

Alan brought back to our memories tennis related poems and read a few of the verses from the John Betjeman poem 'Miss Joan Hunter Dunn' and spoke of the two lines from Kipling's poem 'If' to be found above the players entrance to Centre Court:-



'If you can keep your head when all about you, Are losing theirs and blaming it on you'.....

Tennis has been Alan's life since he first won a junior championship in Scotland and later on in the administration of the game, meeting many stars of the game and show business personalities, he named his favourite lady player as Serena Williams, but he described his meeting her majesty The Queen as being the most magical


