## Review of the 15th October Plaza Presentation - by Paul Ollett Saint, Sinners, Stars & Scandals - Derek Blunt



A bright sunny morning greeted us as we opened the Plaza doors to a steady stream of members coming to only our second proper meeting since some relaxation of the Covid restrictions.

We were pleased to welcome our guest speaker Derek Blunt with wife Lindsey for an absorbing presentation on characters from Northamptonshire's rich history dating from the distant past to modern day.

Derek is an accomplished and prolific author on our county and has added to his literary portfolio by completing two more books during the 'Lockdown' period. He is currently researching for a further two books one of which deals with the large estates owned by landed gentry in our county. For sure it will be a good read for those interested in local history.

The talk was illustrated with Powerpoint projected images onto the big screen and for added interest Derek had devised a quiz requiring audience participation to try and name the characters in his presentation. Periodically one of the slides would have a number and with a few clues Derek encouraged the audience to try and name the place or person from the displayed image. It certainly added a twist to the talk with twelve questions to challenge our knowledge. Even with modern stars such as Maisie Summers Newton (Olympic swimmer) and Dame Sarah Gilbert (Astra Zenica vaccination).

Derek's knowledge took us from the South of the county with a tale of St Werburgh who died in 700 AD and was the Abbess of Weedon who is depicted with her geese on the village sign and in the stained glass of the village church. She was credited with many miracles but the legend of her banishment of the geese from Weedon is perhaps the best known and it is said that even today geese are seldom seen in the area.

Other people from history included the infamous Vicar of Wappenham, near Towcester Theophilus Hart who was far from saintly. He was believed to have fathered up to 15 illegitimate children by his parishioners but unfortunately for him at least, he was caught in the act by a butcher who came home unexpectedly and found the vicar with his wife. After a short chase the seventy year old vicar was decapitated on the spot by the butcher's cleaver.

We learned the tale of 'Wicked' Bobby Bannister the tyrannical Landlord from Pattenham who was hated by the villagers and met his end by falling from a horse. Unfortunately his evil did not end there and his ghost was said to haunt the village until exorcised by the diocesan Bishop of the day.

Of great interest were the tales relating to Deene Park home to the Brudenell Family located in the North of the county. James Brudenell, 7<sup>th</sup> Earl of Cardigan renowned for leading the disastrous Charge of the Light Brigade at the Battle of Balaclava who 'enjoyed' an open marriage arrangement with his first wife and began a liaison with Adeline, a vivacious woman some 40 years his junior. Adeline was known for her extravagances enjoying lavish parties. They became married after the death of James first wife and are now entombed together in Deene church.

Derek's extensive knowledge of the scoundrels and saints among our nobility, politicians, sports and stars of the entertainment world certainly met our expectations and appeared to be enjoyed by all.

There were far too many famous people mentioned to do justice to their lives and achievement in this single page but the presentation by Derek and Lindsey held us intrigued and fascinated to learn of the rich history in our county and amazing people who lived and in some cases are still making their mark in both local and national society.



#### Meatball Black Bean Chili


#### Ingredients

2 tbsp olive oil

12 beef meatballs

1 onion, finely sliced

2 mixed peppers, sliced



- 2 large garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 tsp hot smoked paprika
- 2 tsp ground cumin
- 1 heaped tbsp light brown soft sugar
- 2 x 400g cans chopped tomatoes
- 2 x 400g cans black beans drained and rinsed Cooked rice to serve



#### Step1

Heat the oil in a large flameproof casserole dish over a medium heat. Fry the meatballs for 5 minutes until browned. Transfer to a plate with a slotted spoon.

#### Step2

Fry the onion and peppers with a pinch of salt for 7 minutes, Add the coriander stalks, garlic, paprika and cumin. Fry for 1 minute. Add the sugar, tomatoes and beans and bring to a simmer. Season, return meatballs to the pan, cover and cook for 15 minutes.

#### Step3

Serve the chilli with the rice and the coriander leaves scattered over.
