Ian provided a lively and interesting review of the village history over thousands of year up to recent times when Land Girls were housed in Nissen huts in a field on the outskirts.

Beanstalk is a national charity that recruits and trains people like you to volunteer to go into a local primary school to support children who are struggling with their reading. Beanstalk has been working with schools for almost 40 years to help raise literacy standards.

In Northamptonshire we are currently supporting

around 450 children across the county but we currently have more schools and children waiting for reading helpers than we have volunteers.

As a reading helper you will work with three children and spend 30 minutes with each child twice a week - you will chat, read and play games.

Before they start we provide training to our reading helpers and ensure they have resources for their sessions. These are suited to the children they're helping by providing them with Beanstalk book boxes.
