



Lyveden – An Unfinished Dream - Susan Lees

There was a great turn out for our meeting on 21st September when we welcomed Susan Lees, a volunteer for The National Trust at Lyveden New Bield, to talk to us on this magnificent although unfinished lodge, located between Brigstock and Oundle.

The scheme was designed as a complex of gardens and orchards with a lodge house, the approach to the property being through the gardens from the Manor House, which was the family home of Sir Thomas Tresham.



Sir Thomas, who had envisaged the New Bield scheme, was an educated man, although his handwriting belied this. It was at times difficult to decipher, due to a tendency for him not only to write across the page in the normal manner but to also to form his words up and down the page as well. He was an enthusiastic gardener with a broad knowledge of plants.

The works to construct the building and gardens commenced in 1595 but ended abruptly in 1605 following the death of Sir Thomas. The family had accrued massive debts of £1.7m and therefore no funds were available to complete the scheme. Lady Tresham, his widow, was obviously a woman of great integrity, as she sold off some of her husband's estate to Henry Cecil in part to repay the debts she was left with.

Works to partly restore the gardens and orchards by The National Trust commenced in 1995, including the planting of an orchard of fruit trees of traditional old English varieties. The location of the orchard in an area where the weather conditions are almost hostile, greatly affects the yields from the trees. A Labyrinth has been included with a mile long pathway where the grass is allowed to grow to knee height, being cut down only once each year. Other works include water features and spiral mounts, which were designed to facilitate an elevated view of the gardens. The lodge building has a 'footprint' in the shape of a Maltese Cross and has been carefully orientated 19° from true North to ensure that sunshine will naturally penetrate certain of the windows on 21st November, the day of 'The Presentation of the Virgin Mary'. Many other religious symbols



are to be found in roundels carved in to the stonework and empty niches still exist that are thought to have been created to house religious statuary.

In 1744, plans to turn the unfinished structure into a hunting lodge were abandoned, with no further works having been carried out and at some point some of the stonework was taken away to Oundle where it may still be seen next to the Ship Inn.

Back in 1959 the owners of the property advertised nationally for a 'hermit' to live in the cottage at the

site and in response, received 56 applicants interested in living in this very remote spot, with no services except for a well with hand drawn water.

Lyveden New Bield today is held within the care of the National Trust and largely maintained by volunteers. It is open through the Summer months daily and from the end of October until the end of March at weekends only.

Please come and sign up as this is a show not to be missed!


