Founded in the earliest of this Branch's days, the Group now has 9 members, with room for 1 more. We meet on the second Wednesday of each month, usually in Thrapston, at 10:00 hrs for 2 hours. It must be one of the jolliest groups around because people keep coming, with their stories on a theme agreed at the previous meeting, which they read aloud for the pleasure and enjoyment of the rest of us.



We are a pretty mixed bunch representing diverse backgrounds, upbringing, political and religious beliefs and life experiences. That's partly what makes it fun, because 'at our age' it's those things which are a rich source of supply for our material. Not that there's anything fuddy or duddy about it, for we have explored the many hidden depths of genres such as the supernatural, science fiction, romance, comedy, tragedy and, (yes, this is true), sex – nothing unduly explicit or smutty, mind you, but as a challenge to find how writers of our generation, or any generation for that matter, could deal with a subject in a way that could be presented to (almost) anyone without causing embarrassment or offence. That already done, of course, means we can leave that particular subject alone for evermore, if we wished to.

We deal in a variety of media; fiction prose, journalism, poetry, play script/dialogue, autobiography and biography. We are each currently embarking on research into a subject about which we know absolutely nothing, or very little, in order to hone our skill and ability to write authoritatively, in fact, about (almost, again) anything.

Two of our members have self-published some of their own works and we are all published in the twice-yearly editions of *Pick 'n' Mix,* a selection of works chosen by the individual authors themselves, the sales of which have so far guaranteed future publications. Any surplus is earmarked for local charitable/worthy causes.

Now, I wouldn't want any of this to put off anyone who might have been considering joining us but now thinks we are just a bunch of ageing intellectuals who like showing off – far from it. We are as ordinary as any other people; but wait - nobody is ordinary, really, are they? Furthermore, anyone who wants to do it, can; there is nothing to be frightened of. We are a Group in the true spirit of the U3A – the learners also teach and the teachers also learn. None of us started off as an accomplished writer, but, five years down the line, I think we are all beginning to get there. If you want to join us, please give me a call. If you just want to read our out-pourings – that's fine too; but please do one of the two!

English Group

The idiosyncrasies of our language provide a wonderful source for discussion and some gentle research. Its history, starting, not with the arrival but the departure of the Romans, the subsequent invasions of the Germanic tribes, the Vikings and of course the Normans, throws light on our confused spelling and our rich and unpredictable vocabu-



lary. Chance has played a part in the evolution of the language, as well as conquest, but it has been influenced by many other things, among them science and medicine which needed to coin words, fashion and even ignorance.

We grew up with the idea of grammar, right and wrong, but who set the rules? Why can't you have a double negative? (The French do and so did Shakespeare and Chaucer). Some phrases though, are at the very least unfortunate, like the so-called dangling modifier such as, "being in a dilapidated condition, I was able to buy the house very cheap". Though whether the Rev Spooner really did tell a student he must "leave by the town drain" is another matter.

We interest and entertain ourselves discussing these things and many more in the English group; eponyms, malapropisms, idioms, metaphors, euphemisms, accents and dialects have been among the topics in the past. We also look briefly at the lives and works of well known poets, dramatists and novelists throughout the ages.

Sadly there are no spaces at present; the exchange of views and anecdotes would not be possible if the group were any bigger. Over the years of running the group I have, however, built up a large collection of material which I would happily share with anyone wanting to start a second group.


