The booking is for a private guided tour of the Royal Courts of Justice where the guide will tell us about the architecture and fascinating history of the building as well as about the courts' most famous cases. We will see all of the RCJ's most stunning rooms including the robing galleries. Subject to court listings, some of the group may be able to hear a Live court case at the end of the tour. At 1pm we will board the coach again for a free afternoon at **COVENT GARDEN** with time to watch the entertainers, have a leisurely lunch, or visit the shops in the Piazza.

Just off the Piazza is the LONDON FILM MUSEUM dedicated to "Bond in Motion", featuring over 100 vehicles and artefacts spanning all 24 James Bond Films including the famous Aston Martin, BMW cars, TukTuk Taxi, and the Octopussy Q boat.

You can buy your ticket on entry to the museum at the concession price of £9.50 per person. Our coach will be picking up at Higham Ferrers at 8.20m then at Orbit Tyres Rushden at 8.30am for our entry ticket to the RCJ at 11am. Birthstone

The September birthstone is the sapphire, which was once thought to guard against evil and poisoning.

Sapphire is a form of corundum that is typically blue, a colour caused by tiny bits of firon and titanium; the vivid, medium blues are more valuable than lighter or darker forms. Due to various trace elements, sapphires also appear in other colours. Those with red colours are called rubies.

Sapphires were thought to encourage divine wisdom and protection. They symbolized purity, truth, trust, and loyalty. Some believed that if they were placed in a jar with a snake, the snake would die.

The sapphire, along with the related ruby, are the second-hardest natural gemstones, with only the diamond being harder.
